
**Gwyntarian** - no in person meetings in January on line meetings Jan 6th and 20th info on classes will be posted on web site.

**Tomfoolery**- by Mistress Catriona nicHugh McLae

The fool of Medieval times used humor to mock, satirize, and entertain. They could speak when others had to be silent, accepting society's norms. The fool shows up throughout history in literature, film, TV, video games, entertainment, and art. Think of modern standup comedians, "dumb blondes," and the long lasting "Saturday Night Live." The fool was and is free to explore "out of the box" thinking. He/she speaks truths because they are not chained to what everyone else accepts to be true. Indeed, the mark of a wise person is that they often do not find the fool funny, for they know the true target of the joke is not the fool, but the fool's audience. In the Middle Ages, there were two kinds of fool. The natural fool who was physically and/or mentally challenged. There was also the artificial fool who was a witty entertainer and social critic. The change from the coarse, naive,



raucous natural fool into a more refined, courtly artificial fool reflects the fool's transition from the Medieval age to the Renaissance.
